I will walk to the front of the building, and I will go through the doors to find the will call table to my left.



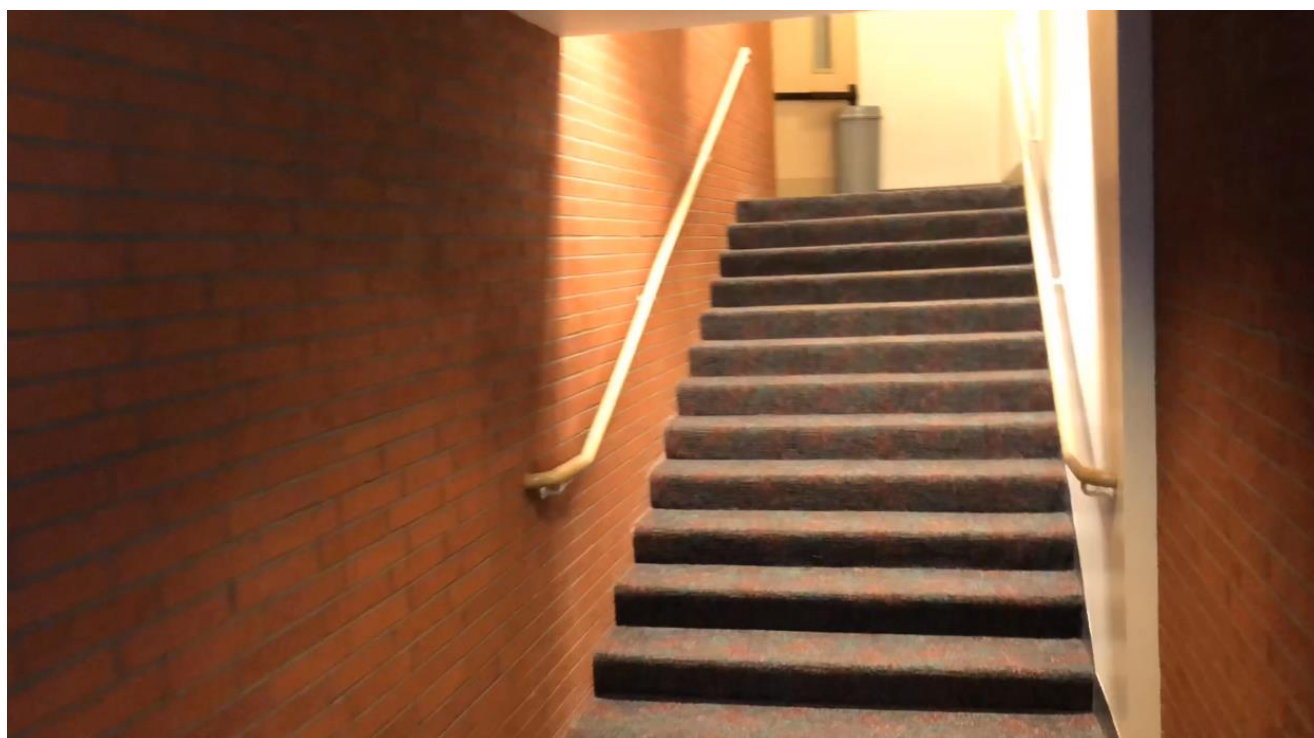

After I get my ticket, I will wait in the lobby before the show starts. The lobby has restrooms in case I need them. I can enjoy a snack in the lobby before the show too.

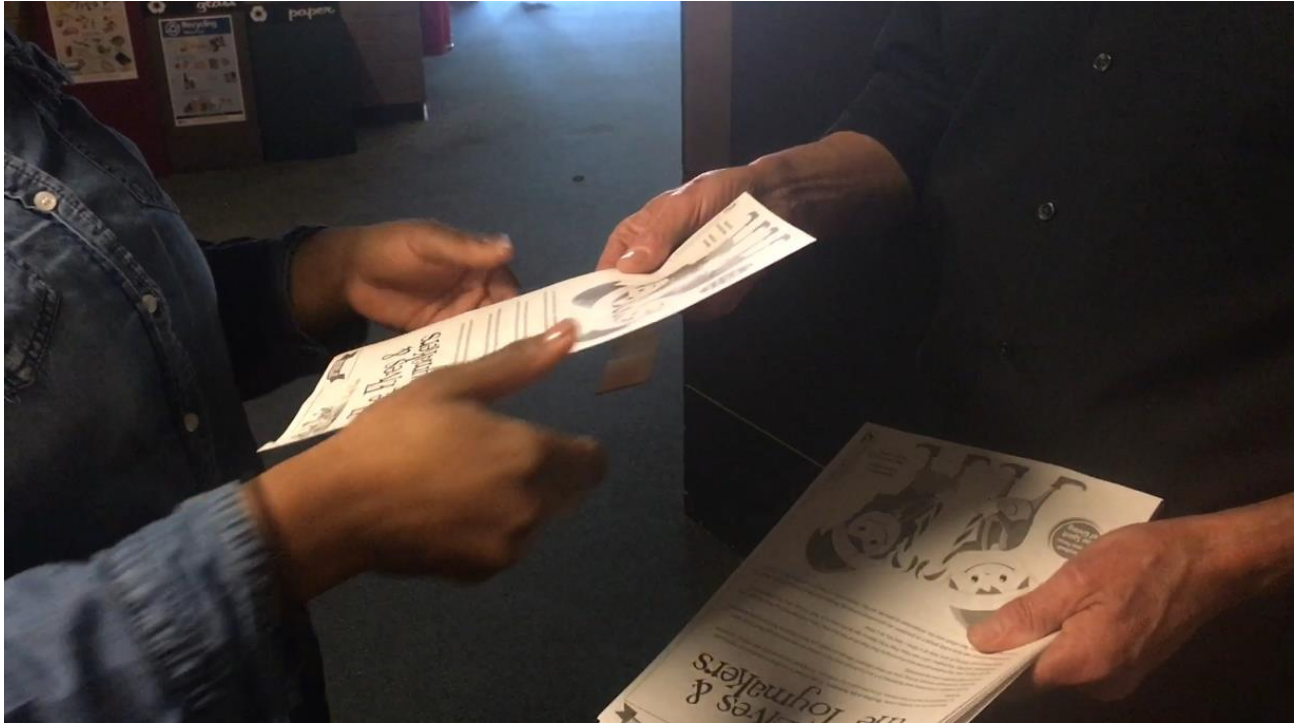


After I get my ticket, I will head around the corner, travel up some stairs to the auditorium where the show will take place.





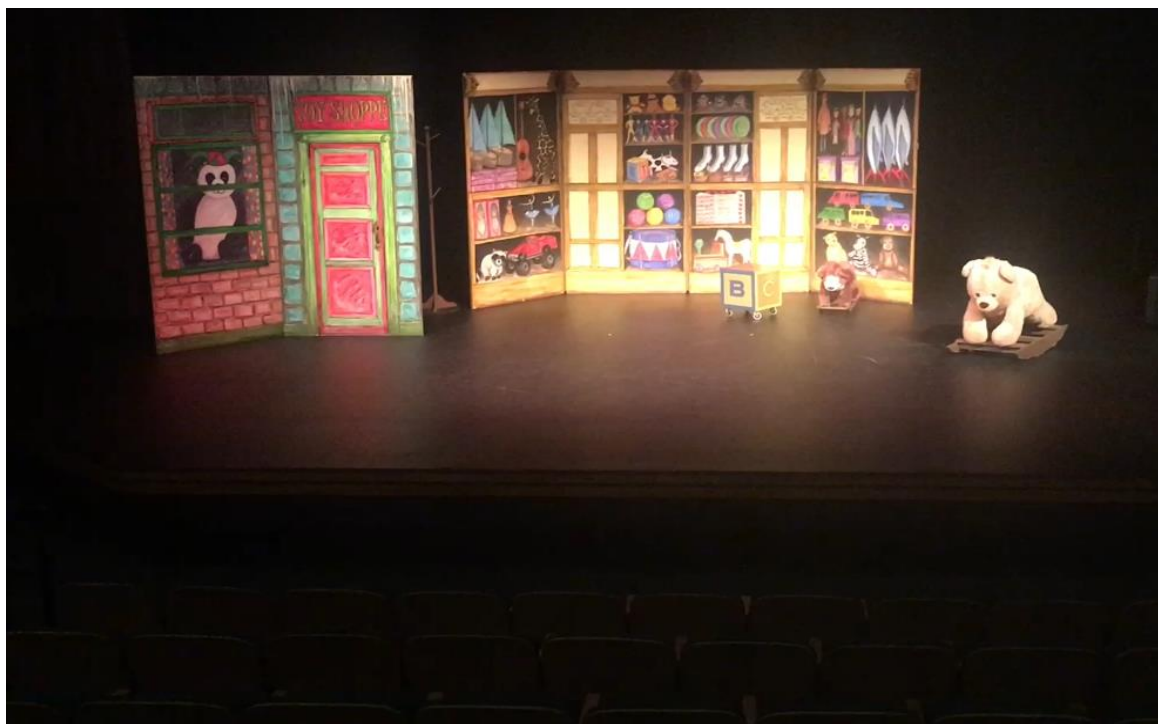
When I go into the auditorium, the usher will give me a play guide of activities and information about the show.

A woman named Susan Bardsley will come on stage and make a few announcements. Then, the actors will come on stage and tell a story through song and dance.

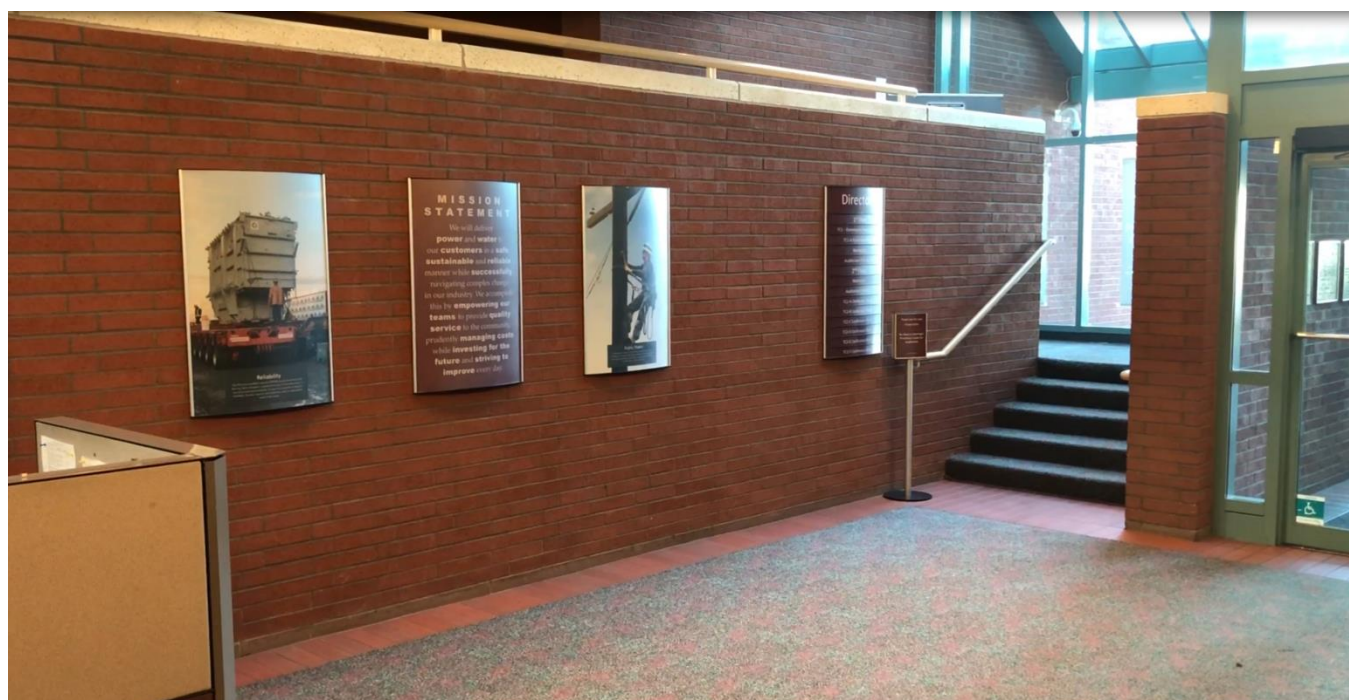




During the show, there might be some audience participation. I can participate if I want, but I don't have to. There also might be some clapping. I can clap or I can cover my ears if it gets too loud.
